Update on Anti-Neighborhood Bills

If you are keeping up with what is going on regarding Short Term Rentals (STRs), here is a brief review.

Through the efforts of the Dallas Neighborhood Coalition and the Texas Neighborhood Coalition, and active residents, neighborhoods across the state have retained more local control.

Here are 6 bills that died in Austin as a result of the Coalitions' work.

1. The ADU* and mini-lot bills

2. The party house bill died in committee.

3. The state-wide STR preemption bill was converted to a study and then died in committee.

4. The Airbnb/VRBO immunity bill did not get a hearing.

5. The STR preemption bill targeting the small town of Volente was withdrawn.

6. An STR state-wide preemption amendment on a fast-track bill was defeated.

*Additional Dwelling Units

At the June 14th Dallas City Council Meeting KISS was approved with some minor amendments. Hard work from many people saved the neighborhoods. Neighbors across the area will have to band together again in 2 years when the Texas Legislature reconvenes.

Meanwhile, neighbors will need to learn what the new rules are for reporting problems.

A Neighbor Asked, "What Are the Dallas Parking Regulations?"

Below is a list of violations applicable to the neighborhood as listed in the Dallas Parking Code. To report a parking violation, **call Dallas 3-1-1 at (214) 670-3111**. The report must include the type of parking violation, the location of the violation, the license plate number of vehicle in violation, the description of the vehicle in violation, and if violation is occurring on public or private property.

SEC. 28-81.1. STOPPING, STANDING, OR PARKING PROHIBITED IN SPECIFIED PLACES.

Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or to be in compliance with the law or the directions of a police officer, a traffic and parking controller, or an official trafficcontrol device, a person commits an offense if he stops, stands or parks a vehicle:

- (A) in front of a public or private driveway;
- (B) within 15 feet of a fire hydrant;
- (C) within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection;

(D) within 30 feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic-control signal located at the side of a roadway;

SEC. 28-84. PARKING FOR MORE THAN 24 HOURS PROHIBITED.

A person commits an offense if he leaves standing or parked in a public street, alley, or other public place, an unattended vehicle or other private property for a continuous period of time longer than 24 hours. (Ord. 14584)

SEC. 28-87. PARKING IN ALLEYS

(a) A person commits an offense if he parks or stands a passenger car or light truck in an alley so that any portion of the vehicle:

- (1) obstructs a driveway; or
- (2) limits the width of the alley to less than 10 feet.

(b) This section does not apply to a vehicle when it is used for construction, maintenance, or repair work in an alley or when it has a defect which immobilizes the vehicle. (Ord. Nos. 14818; 15455)

SEC. 28-88. STANDING OR PARKING ON ROADWAYS A person commits an offense if he:

(1) parks in a direction other than direction of authorized traffic

(2) parks with the right-hand wheels of the vehicle more than 18 inches from the right-hand curb or edge

Basics



- Permit from City is required
- There is a limit of two (2) garage sales at a premise during any twelve (12) month period (**NOT by calendar year**) and each sale may not exceed more than three (3) consecutive calendar days in length.
- Signs must be placed on private property; Signs placed on medians, public property or utility poles are illegal
- Signs must be removed within 24 hours of sale.
- 1st Garage Sale -No Fee
- 2nd Garage Sale -\$25.00 (No Cash)

It's Tarantula Coming Out Time in Texas!

From May to October, with the largest number in July, is when male tarantulas come out of their burrows by the thousands to seek female mates.



There are 14 species in Texas; the most common being the Texas Brown

Tarantula. Females can live for 25 years, but males rarely live over 2-3 months after reaching maturity. Females lay 100-1000 eggs in a web constructed like a hammock and are guarded by the female in a burrow. If you want to find a tarantula in Texas, you will need to lift stones and logs in grassland areas in the hope of spotting one. They are rather secretive.

Aaron Goodwin, assistant zoological manager at the Dallas Zoo, said there is no reason to worry when you see a tarantula. Their size may seem amazing, or be frightening at first sight. Their bite can be painful to humans, but not harmful. They are not usually aggressive, tending to be rather docile.

When disturbed, tarantulas maneuver to face the threat and will raise up on their hind legs and stretch out their front legs in a threatening posture. They also may rapidly brush the top of their abdomen with their hind legs which dislodges hairs which irritate the eyes or skin of an attacker.

You may have seen or read about a tarantula being kept as a pet. Trapping or keeping one as a pet should not be attempted. "Just observe them," says Goodwin, take pictures and let them go their way."

No Garbage or Yard Debris Only These Items (Do Not Put in Plastic Trash Bags)

<u>Glass Bottles and Jars</u>--NO window glass, light bulbs, fluorescent tubes, ceramics, mirrors or Pyrex

<u>Plastics</u>--containers (rinsed) labelled #1-5 & 7 (found at the base of the container in the recycling emblem) **NO** plastic grocery bags (take those to the store), plastic wrap, plastic utensils, chemical containers or Styrofoam

<u>Metals</u>--steel, tin and aluminum **NO** foil or foil containers used for baking; no electronics or toys

Paper Products and Cardboard--newspapers, books (both paper and hardback) magazines, catalogs, envelopes, food and detergent boxes, paper egg cartons, 1-pack drink cartons, cereal boxes, folded corrugated and cardboard boxes; **NO** food contaminated boxes or plastic or foil-lined boxes or shredded paper
